
Cuts to Education Funding will hurt our students and our schools



Let's look at the impact

Fiscal Responsibility

Alberta Education could ask all school divisions in the province to cut budgets by 5%.

For Palliser Regional Schools, this means cutting \$3.6 million.

That 7% cut \$5.1 million

But we also have a contractual obligation to honour.


In reality, Palliser would be facing a 7% cut.

Where will a cut of \$5.1 million hurt us? Everywhere.

Palliser pools resources and provides centralized services to all schools. School budgets are based on needs. It's not as simple as basing a budget on student numbers alone. As a result, when the budget crunch hits, it hits everyone. Every school. Every community. Every service we provide. \$5.1 million is more money than most of us can imagine. How much is it, really?

To account for \$5.1 million, we'd need to eliminate 48 full-time teaching positions, leaving 355 teachers. OR We could eliminate every educational assistant in the system OR every position housed in Central Office in Lethbridge and still not save the full

\$5.1 million.

The provincial budget will be announced March 26, 2015.

What's at stake is class size, supports for students and the quality of education for our next generation of leaders.
