IN FURTHERANCE OF APPEAL No. 2022-01, BE IT MOVED THAT, for the purpose of the April 11, 2022, Special Board meeting regarding Board Appeal No. 2022-01 ("Appeal"), the Board of Trustees of Palliser School Division proceed with said Appeal in accordance with Board Policy 11: Appeals and Hearings Regarding Student Matters and that, more specifically, the Board hereby adopts the following timeline for today's Appeal, which shall proceed in camera in person before the Board:

Chairperson: Secretary Treasurer:

- Senior Administration shall present first and make oral representations to the Board. Thirty (30) minutes will be allowed for this;
- Following this, the parent appeal representative group (Representative • Group) then be granted thirty minutes to make oral representations to the Board on behalf of all the Appellants. Thirty (30) minutes will be allowed for this:
- To the extent any individual parent appellant has facts or arguments which • are unique to the individual and which were not addressed by the Representative Group, an individual Appellant may also make oral representations to the Board. Five (5) minutes will be allowed to each such parent appellant. No repetition will be allowed. The objective is that the Representative Group will set out and submit all the facts and arguments in support of the appeal on behalf of all parent appellants;
- The Representative Group and individual parent appellants, if any, shall not • be entitled to divide allocated time. Again, for efficiency purposes, the Representative Group is required to submit all facts and submissions during its allocated turn. Individual parent appellants shall only be afforded an opportunity to make oral representatives for up to a five (5) minute period, if they have facts or arguments which materially differ from those of the Representative Group:
- Senior Administration will have a total of fifteen (15) minutes to respond to the oral submissions of the Representative Group;
- The Representative Group will have a total of fifteen (15) minutes to respond to Administration's submissions. No parent appellant will have a right of reply as the right of reply will be given by the Representative Group;
- Board members will then have an opportunity to ask questions or seek • clarification to either party;
- Senior Administration will then have ten (10) minutes to make closing comments
- The Representative Group will also have ten (10) minutes to make closing comments. No parent appellant will have a right to make closing statements as the closing statements will be given by the Representative Group;
- The Board will deliberate without the parties in attendance; •
- If the Board requires additional information or clarification to render its decision, both parties would be requested to attend before the Board to respond to questions or points of clarification;
- The Board hereby reserves the right and discretion to apply rules of procedure that may differ than those set out in Board Policy 11 as reasonably required.
